Inspiring classics – open window motif



The aim of this class is to create your own unique decorative surface by exploring the threedimensional "open window" motif. Participants will learn design principles by combining "the window" with various views through it. Through the creative approach such classical to techniques as cutting, folding, pleating at least 3-4 different "views" will be made. Additionally will students receive guidelines on several finishing options how to incorporate "the window" in the composition of the artwork. This piece may also further function as an idea or a part for a bigger quilt.

Fabrics and length (in cm):

4-5 cuts (ca. 20 x 20 cm) of cotton, 4-5 cuts (ca. 25 x 25 cm) and 2-3 cuts (ca. 30 x 30 cm) of different fabrics – soft cotton, silk, synthetics- several bright and lively colours as well as contrasting. Background fabric (ca. $40 \times 40 \text{ cm}$).

Other supplies:

Fusible interfacing ($40 \times 40 \text{cm}$) and batting ($40 \times 40 \text{cm}$); machine embroidery threads – variegated, bright coloured rayon threads, 2-3 sheets (A4) of double -sided adhesive web (for example, Bondaweb)

A possibility to buy a kit (optional).

Participants will have the choice to buy the kit or to bring the corresponding supplies.
